WHAT TO BRING CHECKLIST

Information & Forms to Bring

- Valid Picture I.D.
- Social Security Number cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) cards/letters for all persons listed on the tax return.
- Birth dates for all persons listed on the tax return.
- Prior year tax return
- Direct Deposit information showing account and routing numbers
- Income Forms:
 - √ Wages from each job (Form W-2)
 - √ Interest (Form 1099-INT)
 - √ Dividends (Form 1099-DIV)
 - √ Retirement Plans (Form 1099-R)
 - √ Gambling Winnings (Form 1099-2G)
 - √ Unemployment (Form 1099-G)
 - √ Social Security Benefits (Form SSA)
- Yearend Statements:
 - √ Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - √ MN Family Investment Program (MFIP)
 - √ MN Supplemental Aid (MSA)
 - √ General Assistance (GA)
 - √ Veterans' Benefits
 - √ Worker's Compensation

Increase Your Tax Refund

Did you pay for any of these expenses in 2004?

EDUCATION EXPENSES

Kindergarten through 12th grade purchases for your children attending school. For example: tutoring, rental/purchase of instrument, music lessons, pens, pencils, notebooks, and educational software. **Bring itemized cash register receipts or statements showing payment.**

College, technical college, or classes you paid for yourself, spouse, or dependent. Bring Form 1098-T, Tuition Payment Statement sent from your school. If you paid student loan interest bring Form 1098-E.

DAYCARE EXPENSES

Daycare expenses you paid for your children. You must bring daycare provider's name, address, and tax identification number or social security number.

CHARITABLE DONATIONS

Cash and property contributed to a nonprofit or religious organization. Estimate your property donations by the fair market value not the original cost of the property.

MEDICAL EXPENSES

This applies to taxpayers that are homeowners and/or have paid **high medical expenses not reimbursed by insurance.**

HOMEOWNERS

Mortgage interest and real estate taxes. Bring your 2004 Mortgage Interest Statement (Form 1098) sent by your mortgage company.

For the Property Tax Refund, bring your Statement of Property Tax Payable in 2005 that is sent in March.

RENTERS

For the Property Tax Refund, bring your Certificate of Rent Paid (CRP) provided by your landlord.
